School Day

A reminder that the school day starts with classroom doors opening at 8.40am and registration at 8.45am. Anyone arriving after 8.50am will be marked as late. We appreciate it is hard to get going on these dark, dismal mornings but it is important that children are in the classroom ready to learn on time. Arriving late disrupts the classroom and can also make it challenging for the children who have missed out on initial instructions and information about the day, to fully engage in their learning.

Can I also remind you that if you arrive late and the main gate is closed you will need to come into school via the office to register your child. Going to the back doors of the classrooms means that the staff are interrupted once they have started the day with their class.

Please also remember to close the gate behind you.

Followed by a character-led storytelling session with the legendary Odysseus the telling tales of the Trojan War and his long, and adventurous journey home to Ithaca.

Pine, Birch and Oak Classes were finding out about the 'The Battle of Britain' last term and visited RAMM Museum in Exeter. They

learnt not only about survival, but also about how people worked together to 'do their bit' to help the war effort by taking part in the following workshops: Exeter Blitz and Home Life; Clothing and Uniform; Air Raids and the ARP Warden; Rationing, Food and Dig For Victory; A Postcard Home.
