Year 5 pupils attended Exeter Cathedral's event of remembrance on Holocaust Memorial Day. They sang beautifully to the audience – it was a very moving performance. They also listened attentively to the service and a talk about Kindertransport.

As part of their Egyptian Temples & Tourists topic, Pine, Birch and Oak Class had a fabulous day at The Royal Cornwall Museum. They learnt about the mummification process through a practical hands-on activity and talk; examined the many Egyptian artefacts exhibited in the museum (including a real mummy); handled and learnt about Egyptian artefacts that are thousands of years old; took part in an activity trail around the museum; and explored the interactive gallery.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 enjoyed a thrilling and interactive concert presented by awardwinning composer and conductor, James Redwood. Explore the Orchestra: Dance, Dance,

Dance! showcased the orchestral families, while exploring brilliant examples of how musicians and composers have stretched the boundaries of music. Wild Tribe News:

Holsworthy Kingfishers is a project enabling school children to contribute water testing data to a global dataset run by the Earthwatch Europe Charity. The children will be taking samples and conducting an environmental assessment, along with water testing each month to



assess the health of the river Deer. This is a fantastic opportunity for the children to get involved in meaningful, real life citizen science as the future guardians of our environment and to build a sense of ownership, awareness and understanding of the natural assets around us.


Safer-Internet Day
